Customer Need Statement	Metric	Unit
Maintain Confidentiality	N/A	N/A
Provide Resources	How many times do customers click on the resource links	# of clicks
Link Survivors	How many times the customers fill out the contact form or send an email	# of emails/contacts
Assure Safety	Advise customers to use a specific safety feature (her example was duckduckgo → we should look into that)	# of customers who use a safety feature
Portable Access	How many customers are trying to use the mobile website?	Use google analytics to see how many people log onto the mobile website
